# DBT Mindfulness Skills Training Eight Thursdays beginning September 22 | 1 pm (in-person only) Presented by Rev. Dr. Steve Moore

Back by popular demand! This introduction to mindfulness training is based on skills from Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT). DBT mindfulness skills are specifically designed to be nondenominational and compatible with a wide variety of traditions and beliefs. This class will be especially helpful for people who are struggling with their own spiritual practice, emotional dysregulation, or want to learn more about mindfulness for better health and well-being.

The training will take place on Thursdays from 1-2:30 pm at the Spiritual Renewal Center. Space is limited to 8 participants. No one will be turned away for inability to pay. This class is not a substitute for psychotherapy but may compliment your current practice.

Steve Moore is the director of the Spiritual Renewal Center, spiritual director and clinical psychologist. He was intensively trained in DBT and has conducted DBT groups in a variety of settings. # Wisdom Wednesday: The Cloud of Unknowing


Wednesdays beginning on **September 7** at 4:00-5:00pm, virtual option available.

## **Hand to Hand Fair Trade Gift Shop**


